
65% of population in India uses Ayurveda and medicinal herbs for their primary healthcare needs¹



The wellness sector contributes significantly to Uttarakhand's economy, with an estimated GDP of INR 1,500-2,000 crores.

- 1 Uttarakhand's natural endowments make it an ideal destination for wellness tourism.
 - Tapt Kund and Gangnani hot springs, are believed to treat skin, scalp, and arthritis issues due to high Sulphur content
 - Glacial water from Himalayan springs, lakes, and rivers is rich in magnesium, potassium, calcium, and antioxidants, which promote collagen production.
 - Kasar Devi in Almora boasts one of the world's top three geomagnetic fields, making it a sought-after meditation destination
- 2 Rishikesh is known as the Yoga capital of the world
- The state is home to renowned wellness resorts like Six Senses Vana, Ananda in the Himalayas, Taj Rishikesh, and Veda5 Retreat, offering a range of wellness therapies, yoga, meditation, and naturopathy treatments.





Uttarakhand has 40+ AYUSH Colleges for trained AYUSH Manpower

- 1 Education and research in Ayurveda and traditional medicinal systems in Uttarakhand have historical roots in ancient manuscripts written in Garhwali and Kumaoni dialects by local vaidyas (Ayurvedic practitioners).
- 2 The occupation of *Vaidyak* (Ayurvedic practice) has a long tradition in the state, with key districts like Chamoli and Rudraprayag having a strong presence of traditional vaidyas.
- 3 The apex AYUSH university in the state is Uttarakhand Ayurved University (UAU) in Dehradun, with 22 affiliated colleges, including Gurukul and Rishikul Ayurveda colleges.
- 4 There are five Ayurveda colleges in Uttarakhand offering Post Graduate programs in clinical and non-clinical streams.
- 5 Bhartiya Chikitsa Parishad operates 25 AYUSH Paramedical colleges, and the Homeopathic Medicine Board operates 7 paramedical colleges in the state.
- 6 1,300-1,500 students graduate annually from AYUSH related courses at graduate and post graduate levels
- 7 Research bodies like the Regional Ayurved Research Institute (RARI) under the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) are involved in advocating research and innovation in AYUSH in Uttarakhand.

- 3. Promotion of Ayurveda, Panchakarma, Yoga and Marma Chikitsa in every State AYUSH health and wellness facility
- Integration of AYUSH and allopathic systems and set-up of AYUSH units in all CHCs¹, Sub-district Hospitals and District Hospitals in next 5 years
- 5. 100% NAAC accreditation for all AYUSH institutes in the State in next 5 years
- 6. Skilling, apprenticeship, and employment programs to boost human capital
- 7. Boost in cultivation of medicinal plants and linkages with manufacturing units
- 8. Expansion of private sector investment across AYUSH manufacturing, healthcare, wellness, and education including upgradation and operation of identified government AYUSH facilities in PPP mode
- 9. Engagement of local communities through various means e.g. AYUSH Grams
- 10. Long-term brand development for AYUSH in Uttarakhand, in collaboration with leading branding agencies, industry experts and academicians



Policy Name

Key Support Provided

- MSME Policy, 2023
- Capital subsidy between 3% to 50% depending on investment & region
- Up to 10% top-up capital subsidy for AYUSH Manufacturing (identified as Most Priority Category)
- Interest subvention between 2% to 4% depending on investment & region
- Stamp duty reimbursement between 50% to 100% depending on region
- MegaIndustrial &InvestmentPolicy, 2021
- Land subsidy: Rebate of 15%-30% depending on investment
- Interest subsidy: 7% for next 5 years
- Reimbursement of SGST: 30%-50% of tax liability for B2C sales in state
- Reimbursement of electricity bill: @INR 1 per unit for 5 years
- Other incentives: reimbursement of electricity duty, stamp duty, land registration fee, subsidy on ETP, payroll assistance
- 3 Tourism Policy 2023
- Capital subsidy of 25% to 50% depending on area of investment
- 1% of maximum capital subsidy for marketing and promotion
- 0.5% of maximum capital subsidy for training and skilling
- 1% of maximum capital subsidy for interest subvention
- 4 Service Sector Policy, 2023
- Land allotment and / or capital subsidy with total benefit up to 25% for wellness projects above INR 100 crore in plain areas and INR 50 crore in hilly areas


